Global Talent Shortage Reaches a 17-Year-High

Nearly **4 in 5 employers globally report difficulty finding the skilled talent they need in 2023,** strengthening +2 percentage points year-over-year and more than double the difficulty in 2015 (38%).







HEIs role in Talent Boost

- The objective of HEIs is to triple the amount of their international students by 2030
- The objective is that 75 % of degree-seeking international students will be employed by the Finnish labour market.
 Currently the employment rate is around 50 %.







Why hire international talent?

In a survey done by Business Finland the Finnish companies replied:

- To bridge the skills gap (50 %)
- To recruit special talent (30 %)
- To develop the working culture (22 %)
- New ways of thinking (12%)
- Growth opportunities that special talent represents (10 %)
- New clients/networks (9 %)
- New markets (8%)
- No positive impact (4%)



International degree students

- There are around 20 000 international degree students in Finland
- They are allowed to work up to 30 hours/week
 No limit for EU citizen
- Hiring an international student as an intern is an easy way to test your own organization

 Challenges in finding an employment that matches qualifications

Not enough internship places
