Becoming student at UT (1)

Academic year 2024/2025 starts on September 2, 2024

Before September 2 you already can

- receive login credentials to use various IT systems, sent by arvutiabi@ut.e (**degree seeking** non-EU students of English taught programmes need have **arrival registered** first; PhD students need to have their employment contract signed);
- sign up for courses in Study Information System (SIS). **Degree-seekers:** info at your first info-session;
- get an Estonian ID code from the Tartu's Welcome Centre. The students of Tallinn/Narva/Viljandi/Pärnu, please contact your Programme Director for further info. **Getting an Estonian ID code is obligatory!**



Becoming student at UT (2)

Academic year 2024/2025 starts on September 2, 2024

As of September 2 you can

- be a student with full rights and obligations 😊, attend courses etc;
- add your Estonian bank account number to SIS, if needed;
- update your profile info in SIS. **All students must update!**
- ask for student status confirmation from dean's office, if needed. Contacts [HERE](#).

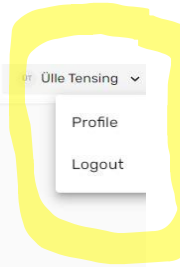

Course registration

New students have until **16.09.2024 (23:59)** to register to courses, as well as to cancel registrations.

There are exceptions, you can see exact registration deadline for each course in Study Information System (SIS/ÕIS).

Don't forget to cancel, if you are not going to take a course, others might be on waiting list!

Once the registration deadline is over, you cannot sign up nor cancel yourself.

Semester work-load 30 ECTS, academic year 60 ECTS

Degree-seeking students of I and II study level

- **Full-time studies: 75-100%** of the courses must be completed each academic year:
at least 45 ECTS by the end of the first, 90 ECTS by the end of the second year etc
- **Part-time studies: 50-75%** of the courses must be completed each academic year:
at least 30 ECTS by the end of the first; 60 ECTS by the end of the second year etc
- **Tuition waiver holders** (English taught curricula): no more than **6 ECTS** short from the required course load
1st semester – 24 ECTS
2nd semester – 54 ECTS
3rd semester – 84 ECTS
...

Exchange students

- Minimum requirement set by UT: at least **15 ECTS** per semester (except PhD-s and trainees);
- On average **20-30 ECTS** per semester;
- Attending a course without completion does not award ECTS.



Important changes as of 2024/2025 for degree seeking students of I and II level

Two-year rule in case of exmatriculation. Students who get exmatriculated (student status terminated) can apply for rematriculation/re-entry to the same programme once **at least two years have passed since the exmatriculation**. One needs to wait for two years no matter what the case of exmatriculation – own initiative, insufficient academic progress or for any other reason. Also applies to fee-based study places. Assessment

A course is considered completed after obtaining the positive result in the assessment of learning outcomes (exam/test/any other form of assignment).

The scales for the assessment of learning outcomes:

- differentiated (grades A, B, C, D, E, F);
- non-differentiated (pass/fail).

The assessment assigned to a course cannot be changed.

Exchange students

In case your home university accepts only differentiated assessment, it is important to know that the **result “pass” of non-differentiated assessment corresponds to the grade 'A'.** It will be stated so on Transcript of Records.

Proving student status

- There is no UT student card, no physical nor electronic, to prove your student status.

Students usually use ISIC card (**International Student Identity Card**). For instructions, please see [Arrival ABC](#).





Fee payment for degree students

I semester payment is due 20 September.

II semester payment is due 20 March.

An invoice will be sent to your ut e-mail address.

Cash payments?

In the second year and onwards, payments are due by October 20 and March 20.

Tuition contracts for degree students

- Tuition-waiver holders receive these from the Admission's office.
- Fee-paying students from their institutes.

Everyone will be informed on what they need to do via e-mail.
