### Insurance system in Estonia

- Solidary health insurance system all medically insured people receive the same quality health care
- Two types of health insurance: <u>state insurance</u> provided by the Estonian Health Insurance Fund (Tervisekassa) and <u>private insurance</u> (private companies)
- Also possibility to use pay per service

## Health care system

- Primary health care is a set of ambulatory services for the most common health problems
- Specialised medical care: ambulatory and hospital care
- Ambulance care is intended for the primary diagnosis and treatment of life-threatening illnesses, injuries or poisonings

## Primary care

- Primary care is provided by family doctors (FD)
   family practicioner/general practicioner/GP
- FD is the first contact point in case of any health problem and illness, also if you need referral to specialised medical care
- Every FD has his own list of patients (~2000)
- Before registering to FD's list, you need local personal ID code
  - \* If you stay here only for a short time period, you do not have to register to FD's list

## Planning a visit to FD

- Call/mail beforehand and book an appointment
- Also possible to book appointments via <u>www.eperearstikeskus.ee</u> if you have a registered FD
- Usually family nurse is the first contact person
- Average time for one consultation is 15-30 minutes
- Please take your ID card or passport and insurance papers with you
- Do not forget to take with you important medical papers

### FD visit

- Primary care services are basically free of charge for persons with Estonian state insurance
- All others may have to pay, depending on the problem (acute vs chronic), type of insurance (EU or not) and clinic (GP centre or private clinic) - ask in advance!
- Keep a record of the costs, you may be able to claim compensation from your own insurance company in your own country

## Health advice via phone consultation

- Advice on <u>minor health problems</u> and <u>guidance</u> on <u>first aid</u>
- The assistance is provided 24/7 in Estonian and Russian; and daily at 15:00-17:00 in English.

## Specialised medical care

You need referral from a FD. Referral is not necessary for:

- Gynaecologist
- Psychiatrist
- Ophthalmologist (eye problems)
- Dermatovenerologist (skin problems)
- Dentist
- Pulmonologist (in case of tuberculosis)
- Infectious Diseases Doctor (in case of HIV/AIDS treatment and for vaccinations)
- Emergency care doctor (in case of emergency)

## Specialised medical care

   If you have EU insurance and you get sick in Estonia and you have referral letter, you have to pay only the visitation fee (5 EUR)
- In private clinics (if possible ask FD advice)
   You usually have to pay the visitation fee plus fee for investigations/procudures (ask in advance)

There are no special medical notes related to traveling to Estonia.

The routine vaccines are **highly recommended**:

- Diphtheria-Tetanus-Pertussis (whooping cough)
- Measles-Mumps-Rubella (MMR)
- Polio
- Flu (influenza)
- Chickenpox (Varicella)
- Hepatitis A and B
- Tick-borne encephalitis
